

Difference between weekly Musical Theatre class and Theatre Company

Our Thursday musical theatre classes are taught by Director, Miss Kim and are a one hour class for students in year 2 and up.

Kim's classes are targeted towards training students in Broadway dance, singing and acting. Students build on their basic jazz dance foundations with technique and choreography found on the Broadway stage.

They will work on singing technique as well as audition technique, singing as both a group and working on their own audition pieces across a range of musical theatre and pop styles.

Through acting games, improvisation exercises, script and monologue work, students will build on their acting skills for the stage.

These classes focus on building skills, with an end of year performance at the concert.

The Theatre Company is for ages 8-18 years and rehearses on a Saturday afternoon from 2.30-5.30pm, working on an end of semester show.

Students will spend the first couple of weeks learning show material to audition for parts in the show, to be cast in week 3 or 4.

Students will receive their own script and spend each week rehearsing as a professional theatre company, working on music, choreography and scenes to put together a fabulous production.

The focus of Theatre Company is rehearsing for a show and putting the skills learnt in musical theatre classes into practice.

For this reason, many of our keen musical theatre performers find that taking a weekly musical theatre class in addition to being part of the Theatre Company, provides them with the best all rounded theatre training."
